IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Christmas Tree Disposal January 3rd
 through January 28th. Trees must be
 placed on the terrace for pickup. All
 objects are required to be removed
 from the tree.
- Winter Garbage & Bulk Collection During winter months bulk items,
 garbage or recycling containers will
 not be collected if placed on top of
 snowbanks or in the streets.
- Winter Parking There will be no parking on the street from 11pm – 6am from December 1st - April 1st
- There are no scheduled Bulk Pick-Ups during loose leaf collection 10/31/22 – 11/18/22.
- Per City Code, residents may <u>NOT</u> put loose leaves or other debris in the street at any time, for any reason.
- Recycling can <u>NOT</u> go in the Twin Bridges garbage cart. It is for household trash ONLY.
- Thanksgiving Day Garbage Collection Schedule: Thursday November 24th garbage collection will be picked up on Friday, November 25th and Friday's garbage will be collected on Saturday November 26th.
- There will be no change to garbage collection for *Christmas or the New Year Holiday*.

LOOSE LEAF PICK-UP SCHEDULE

October 31st - November 18, loose leaves will be collected. Leaves need to be raked out to the terrace or just before the edge of the curb for collection; or placed in paper yard/leaf bags. To ensure collection, have your leaves out on the terrace by MONDAY of the scheduled collection week for your ward.

Bulk Garbage Pick-Up Guidelines

- Items will be collected from the terrace limited in size of pile or items to 10-feet in length, 5-feet in width and no taller than 5-feet high.
- No bags or containers more than 50lbs.
- Items are to be placed out no earlier than noon the day before and no later than 6am the day of the scheduled pick up.
- The city will not collect any bulk garbage set out in black plastic bags.
- Please separate any electronics and metal from the rest of the bulk items.
- For the safety of our workforce, during the winter months, bulk items shall not be placed on top of snowbanks. Bulk items set out
 during winter on top of snowbanks will not be collected. Please utilize your driveway apron or a clearing on your terrace when placing
 items out when snowbanks are present on your bulk item pick-up collection day.
- Unacceptable items: tires, hazardous waste, concrete, bricks, engines, household trash, recyclables, large pianos, vehicle batteries, brush or yard waste, black bags, propane tanks, fluorescent tubes, motor oil, liquids/paint, medical waste, fire extinguishers.

Yard Waste & Brush Collection Guidelines

Yard waste and brush collection will be limited to the following:

- Unlimited number of paper yard waste bags can be set out. 50-pound weight limit for each yard waste bag.
- Any loose brush set out will need to be tied or bundled together for collection. Limbs are limited in size to 4" in diameter and no longer than 6-feet in length.
- The volume of any brush material cut up to be collected must be limited to 10-feet in length, 5-feet in width and no taller than 5-feet high.
- Limbs larger than 4" in diameter and/or longer than 6 feet in length will not collected. Larger limbs can be taken to the brush drop-off site located near the dead-end of Beaver Street.
- * The city will not collect any loose leaves during this time. Any loose leaves must be contained within paper yard waste bags.
- *The city will not collect any leaves or yard waste set out in plastic bags.
- * After the first week in October, there will be no brush or bundled small limbs collected of any kind only leaves and other organic material that can fit inside paper yard waste bags will be collected beginning in Mid-October through the end of November to coincide with the fall loose leaf collection program.

Loose Leaf Collection Guidelines

DO NOT rake leaves into the street, as they may block or back-up storm drains during wet weather storm events.

<u>DO NOT</u> contaminate the leaves with trash or other yard waste such as branches, sticks or plastic bags. Leaf piles full of branches and/or sticks will not be collected. Tree limbs and sticks will not be collected during leaf collection. Those items can be taken to the Beaver Street brush drop-off located at the dead end of Beaver Street, which is available to Gloversville residents for organic waste only. No trash or construction debris may be dumped at that location and the site is under 24-hour police camera surveillance.

Residents should always place leaves out as soon as possible to ensure collection. In order to maximize efficiencies and enhance collection efforts, we ask that residents not park cars on the street during your collection week or move cars off the street while crews are present collecting leaves from 7am to 3pm. Parked cars hamper leaf collection efficiency, and some leaf material may get stuck under and around parked cars. If large leaf piles are blocked by parked cars, we may not be able to collect all the leaves to prevent damage to parked vehicles. Twin Bridges Collection Guidelines

- All carts must be out by 5:30AM the day of collection.
- Carts must be placed within 6-feet of the curb or edge of roadway for the automated mechanical arm to reach. Carts placed elsewhere or
 on top of snowbanks will not be collected.
- Only household trash items are permitted which are required to be placed in white or clear trash bags only, then deposited into your cart.
 No recycling is allowed in the container. Please see list below of unacceptable items.
- All garbage set out curbside must be contained within your roll cart. Additional bags, extra containers, loose garbage, or bulk items set
 outside the cart will not be collected.
- Unacceptable Items: aerosol cans, liquids, animals, antifreeze, appliances, asbestos, barrels, batteries, chemical products, computers, contaminates oils, dirt, fluorescent tubes, furniture, hazardous waste, herbicides and pesticides, industrial waste, lawn debris, lubricating/hydraulic oils, medical waste, microwaves, motor oils, oil filters, flammable liquids, paint, petroleum coil/lead paint chips, propane tanks, radioactive material, railroad ties, solvents, televisions, tires, transmission oil, concrete, bricks, demolition materials.
